



## International Admissions Policy

NOTE: Students living internationally should begin this process a minimum of 3½ months prior to the semester to allow time for paperwork to be processed by Davis College and travel documents to be issued. Student is responsible for making their own appointment with the U.S. Embassy in their region. See [studyinthestates.dhs.gov/](https://studyinthestates.dhs.gov/) for more instruction.

### Policy

- **Paperwork Language Requirement:** All documents submitted to Davis College must be translated into English, no exceptions.
- **Age Requirement** - Must be at least 17 years of age at the time of registration.
- **Checklist** - Must complete all items on the “International Student Admissions Checklist.”
- **Foreign Language Speaker** - Applicants whose first language is *not* English must take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). Submit scores to Davis using our Institutional Code (1000). *Minimum score requirements (only one exam type is required):*  
Paper Based exam: 525 | Computer Based exam: 195 | Internet Based exam: 68.
- **Transfer Student** - If you are currently in the United States under an F-1 visa, carrying an I-20 from another school, you must also obtain a “Transfer Eligibility Form” from Davis College and have it completed by your current Designated School Official (DSO).
- **Enrollment Deposit** - Full payment of your enrollment deposit must be made before receiving your I-20.
- **Payment for subsequent semesters** – The student is expected to submit payment at or before the first day of classes each semester.
- **Work-Study**– Students may apply for a student work position.
- **OPT** – Students are eligible to apply to USCIS for 12 months of work eligibility post-graduation. If granted, student is responsible for all additional fees.
- **Scholarship:** All international students are offered a scholarship amounting to 50% of their tuition meal plan, and dorm costs.
